\$50,000 for protecting and conserving drinking water

Do you have a great project that helps conserve water and protect drinking water sources in Tampa Bay?

Get your share of the funding! Grants ranging from \$2,000 to \$10,000 are available to community groups, nonprofits, school groups and educational institutions located in Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas counties.

Examples of Qualifying Projects

Include:

- Local public awareness and outreach campaigns related to source water protection or water conservation
- River and stream clean-ups, including restoration and stabilization of riverbanks
- Protection and preservation of the region's watersheds and aquifer recharge zones
- Innovative solutions to conserve water and/or reduce pollution in wetlands, rivers and coastal areas
- Educational resources such as trainings, workshops, signage or exhibits, and the development of Florida-standards-based curriculum about drinking water and the environment

What is Conservation?

Conservation includes a wide variety of actions and activities aimed at using water efficiently to ensure there is enough water for our community and the environment.

What is Source Water Protection?

Source water protection includes a wide variety of actions and activities aimed at safeguarding, maintaining, or improving drinking water sources and their contributing areas.
